## Resources Tracking and Allocation

*Fall: November 30*  
*Spring: March 29*

This workshop focuses on best practices for tracking and allocation of:

- Personnel: how to track and allocate time spent on services, maintenance, repairs, calibrations, technical development, etc.
- Consumables: how to track and allocate consumables, emphasizing those shared by multiple instruments and service lines.
- Overhead Costs: identifying, tracking, and allocating recharge service center's overhead costs that are allowable and compliant with federal and university policies.

## Rate Review Reporting

*Fall: December 14*  
*Spring: February 22*

This workshop focuses on the preparation and reporting of the annual evaluation of rates in a research service center.

Detailed examples of rate reviews will be presented, emphasizing allowable and not-allowable costs, proper cost distributions, personnel cost allocation, and multi-year investments.

Multiple rates categories within a center/core will be explored, such as external commercial, external academic, and entities outside the US.
